THE MAGNIFICAT

The Magnificat is a poem of praise to God. Sometimes referred to as Mary's prayer, it is sung in Latin. Its message of praise for humility over pride transcends all religions. There are countless hundreds of musical settings of the Magnificat and a magnificent variety of styles and moods across the choral versions of this work throughout the last five centuries or more.

Composed by three musical giants of the Baroque era, the three versions of the Magnificat that we have selected for this concert are amongst the best known and most frequently performed in the world today. Vivaldi composed his various revisions of the work around the period 1717 through to the early 1720s. JS Bach, a contemporary of Vivaldi's, composed his in 1723. His son, CPE Bach, who composed his some twenty-six years later in 1749, was clearly inspired by his father's Magnificat, but is more "modern", very different in style and effect from the high baroque influences and strong theological references of JS Bach.

Annika has been performing since the age of ten; growing up in Central Queensland she travelled up to 750km each week for voice, trumpet, and piano lessons. She holds a Bachelor of Music in Advanced Performance (Classical Voice), a Graduate Diploma of Opera Studies, and a Master of Music Studies (Vocal Pedagogy) from the Queensland Conservatorium of Music.

Annika has performed in numerous mainstage productions as well as operas. In 2015 she was selected for the prestigious Joan Sutherland and Richard Bonynge Bel Canto Award.

At St Stephen's Cathedral in Brisbane up until 2022, Annika was as a soloist, chorister, cantor, and voice teacher, and served for two years as Assistant Director of Music, which she left in 2022 to pursue her growing performance career. In addition to her singing, Annika is a talented trumpet player and teaches both voice and trumpet with Mansfield Musicworx.

JOLANTA KUDRA SOPRANO

Jolanta is a Polish-Australian soprano originally from Berri, a small town in the Riverland region of South Australia. She recently completed her Masters in Music Studies at the Queensland Conservatorium of Music in 2022.



In 2019, Jolanta was an artist with State Opera South Australia Winter School and was awarded the Friends of State Opera Scholarship. In 2021, she was an artist with the Lisa Gasteen National Opera Program.

In 2022, Jolanta was awarded the Linda Edith Allen Postgraduate Award for a female singer at the Queensland Conservatorium. Jolanta also holds a Saint Andrew's Uniting Church Choral Scholarship in collaboration with Musica Viva Australia. Apart from her many performance highlights, Jolanta enjoys reading fiction novels, particularly historical fiction, cooking, and writing poetry and creative short stories.



MORGAN ROSATI MEZZO-SOPRANO

An Italian Australian mezzo-soprano, Morgan is a student at the Queensland Conservatorium of Music pursuing a Postgraduate Diploma, having previously attained a Bachelor of Music Honours from the University of Queensland.

Morgan has performed numerous roles in excerpt performances of operas, and sung at a variety of choral concerts whilst at the University of Queensland.

Morgan won the UQ Ethel Osborn Prize in 2022 and was a finalist in both the 2020 and 2021 UO Ethel Osborn Prizes. In addition to

her studies, Morgan has performed as a backing vocalist for artists such as Mirusia in the vocal ensemble Vocal Manoeuvres. She also sings with the vocal ensemble Lucem Vitae, a group that focuses primarily on sacred music.



SEBASTIAN MACLAINE TENOR

Sebastian attained his Bachelor of Music at the Queensland Conservatorium of Music in 2008, and in 2018 graduated with a Master of Music (Intensive) from the UK Royal Northern College of Music.

He then moved to Hildesheim, Germany, performing with Theater für Niedersachsen as soloist and chorus member.

Sebastian returned to Brisbane in 2021, performing with Opera Queensland in the schools touring productions of La Bohème and The Frog Prince and OQ's Vocal Ensemble. In 2022 he joined the Young Artist Program of Opera Queensland.

Sebastian has had a wide variety of musical experiences, including singing with the popular Australian touring and recording group, The Ten Tenors. With the group, Sebastian has performed extensively in 16 countries, most recently in 2022, and recorded several albums.

LEON WARNOCK BARITONE

Leon graduated from the Queensland Conservatorium of Music with a Bachelor of Music and a Postgraduate Diploma in Opera Performance, and also holds a Bachelor of Education from Griffith University.

He has sung chorus and solo roles with Opera Australia, Victorian Opera and Opera Queensland, and toured NSW schools with Oz Opera.



While based in Germany, Leon was a chorus member of the Theatre Freiburg, where he also performed many solo roles. He has won prizes in the Herald Sun Aria and the National Eisteddfod Canberra and was a semi-finalist in the International Sacred Solo Competition in Rome.

Alongside singing, Leon enjoys high school teaching and is committed to embracing Indigenous culture. He was a soloist in the recent performance by the Queensland Choir and Brisbane Symphony Orchestra where the inspiring words of Oodgeroo Noonuccal in "A Song of Hope" by Williamson were performed.

Quia fecit mihi magna qui potens est: et sanctum nomen ejus. Et misericordia ejus in progenie et progenies timentibus eum. Fecit potentiam in brachio suo: dispersit superbos mente cordis sui. Deposuit potentes de sede: et exaltavit humiles. Esurientes implevit bonis: et divites dimisit inanes. Suscepit Israel puerum suum: recordatus misericordiae suæ. Sicut locutus est ad patres nostros: Abraham, et semini ejus in saecula. Gloria Patri, et Filio, et Spiritui Sancto, Sicut erat in principio, et nunc, et semper, et in sæcula sæculorum. Amen.
